NDAPA Board Teleconference 01-21-07

Meeting was called to order at 9:05 p.m. by President Terrie Wold. Those in attendance were Terrie Wold, Kate Larson, Scott Barry, Pat Blomquist, Lori Dockter and Wayne Kartes.

The minutes of the previous meeting were not readily available, as I was not at my home and did not have access to them. Treasurer's report was given and will be attached to the minutes; there was discussion on moving some money from checking to savings into a CD short term to accrue greater interest. Motion by Wayne, seconded by Scott to move \$5,000 from the checking account into a 12-month CD; all were in favor, motion carried.

Next was the discussion regarding the Leadership Conference to be held in Washington D.C. on February 24 and 25, 2007. Terrie Wold, Scott Barry and Lori Dockter expressed interest in attending and they will work in coordination with Terrie Wold to attend.

Next was discussion on the membership committee. One tactic to hopefully increase membership is to contact North Dakota PA students before they graduate, in hopes of enticing them to join NDAPA. This will be discussed with the membership chairperson.

Next was a report on public relations; Heidi Fitzgerald was not in attendance, but she did have a report to Terrie and noted that letters have been sent to physicians and clinics regarding upcoming PA awards.

Next was discussion regarding the Legislative Committee, headed by Kate Larson and Scott Barry; they recently met with the State Board of Medical Examiners and were pleased with their reception. Terrie Wold will send a letter to the State Board of Medical Examiners naming Scott and Kate as our representatives from NDAPA. These members will place an article in the newsletter regarding encouragement of Physician Assistants to use their representatives, if they have concerns regarding practice in North Dakota.

Kate Larson, head of the CME committee reported that plans for the Spring CME are going very well. She and her committee have most of the arrangements made.

New Business: Terrie Wold will place a note in the newsletter encouraging members to consider attending San Antonio conference as delegates for 2008. The election for these positions will be at the Spring Conference in May.

Being no further business, there was a motion to adjourn; this was made by Scott and seconded by Pat. Meeting was adjourned at 10:00 p.m.

UND PA Program Update

Greetings from the UND PA Program, It has been awhile since I told you of the happenings here at the Program, so there is a lot to tell. First of all, you have probably heard that Terrie Jo Wold is no longer with us as a member of faculty. The 75 mile commute, and sleeping out of a suitcase on other nights gets pretty old after a few years. So Terrie decided to make her roots permanent in Moorhead and, as a result, we are presently looking for another faculty member. Anyone interested???

This past year we did a few changes with the program. First of all, we started a three year pilot program and opened the applicant pool to "other licensed health care professionals with extensive clinical experience" as well as RN's. The first class began in fall and is appreciating the variety of experiences and expertise. We have 18 nurses and 15 "others", including pharmacists, clinical lab scientists, respiratory therapists, FMG's, dietitians, cardiovascular invasive techs, and paramedics. And the majority of this group are from North Dakota and Minnesota. So we had a large contingent of family when we had their White Coat Ceremony.

In reviewing the experience with the first 3 Masters classes, we decided to give the students a more thorough review in Anatomy, Basic EKG's, and Intro to Pharmacology before they come for the first didactic session. As a result, the program is now 22 months long. And, before the students begin in August, we have a week of on-line orientation to get them accustomed to distance learning and on-line coursework. And lastly, this past fall we increased our "core" faculty by one. Vikki McCleary, PhD in physiology, joined the Program. She teaches pathophysiology, coordinated basic anatomy, and intro pharmacology. We are pleased to have her on board. Now... if we just find another PA (Hint to those who might have an interest. Give me a call.)

In Memoriam...

Mickey Knutson, P.A. (B.S.N. '58, F.N.P. '78), founder and former director of the Physician Assistant (PA) and Nurse Practitioner programs, died Jan. 2, 2007 at Orlando, FL. She was 70.



In the early 1970s, she was instrumental in the development of the physician assistant and nurse practitioner programs at the UND medical school. She served as director of the Family Nurse Practitioner Program from 1972 to 1977 and as co-director of the PA Program from 1982 to 1998.

A native of Grafton, ND, Knutson earned a bachelor of science degree in nursing at UND and a master's degree in nursing at the University of Washington in 1961. She completed the Family Nurse Practitioner Program in 1978 at UND.

In 1963, she joined the UND College of Nursing faculty where she served for three years before being named director of St. Francis School of Nursing in Minot. In 1972, she was named director of the Family Nurse Practitioner Program at the UND medical school where she wrote numerous grants which brought more than \$2 million to UND.

During her career, she held many leadership positions with the National Organization of Nurse Practitioner Faculties (including president in 1982), Association of Physician Assistant Programs, North Dakota Academy of Health Practitioners, among others, and wrote extensively on the education of family nurse practitioners and related topics. She received the UND President's Award for Outstanding Service in 1990.

She is survived by her husband, Larry Knutson, Orlando; son and daughter-in-law, Dr. James and Theresa Knutson and grandson, Cole Knutson, all of Sioux City, Iowa.
